To earn certification you must pass the LPC proctored exam (200 multiple choice questions). You are not required to purchase the LPC course prior to taking the exam; however, it is the best study tool available.

The LPC course is composed of 6 modules, 41 sections, nearly 1200 pages of text with curriculum focused on Leadership Principles, Business Principles, LP Operations, Safety & Risk Management, Crisis Management and Supply Chain Security. Each module includes section review questions, practical applications, and a practice exam at the end of the course. The course is delivered 100% online, includes video demonstrations & pictures. It is self paced with no hardcopy or CD. A study gopher allows for note taking which can be printed.
